Your personal details

Any personal information you provide to us (or which is available on public registers) and any User Information from which we identify you is held in accordance with the registration we have with the Information Commissioner's Office. We use your information for the following purposes only:

- To administer this website.

If you have registered to receive notification of new content that may be of interest to you, then we may use your personal information to send you these notifications by email.

We may disclose your personal information and / or User Information if we are asked to do so by the police or any other regulatory or Government authority investigating suspected illegal activities.

What is a cookie?

A cookie is a small file of letters and numbers, which often includes a unique identifier that is sent to your device's browser from a website's computer and is stored on your device's hard drive. Cookies allow a website to recognise a user's device. Websites can send their own cookie to your browser if your browser's preferences allow it.
